Understanding Behaviour Making Sense of Sensory Differences	Examining the overlooked sensory causes behind challenging behaviour and how to recognise and respond to them	For parents and carers who want to understand the core strengths and difficulties of autism and how best to support their child or young person. Suitable for any age.
Adolescence	Understanding and responding to the changes and challenges of parenting and caring for teenagers on the spectrum.	Suitable for parents and carers of young people aged 10 upwards. (Waiting assessment or with a diagnosis).
Girls on the Spectrum	A look at how autism affects girls and young women, why it can be difficult to diagnose and how best to support the unique pattern of behaviours of females on the spectrum.	Suitable for parents and carers of primary and secondary school aged girls and young women. (Waiting assessment or with a diagnosis).
High Alert! When Anxiety Strikes	What to do when worries take over. Looking at what causes anxiety and some tried and tested strategies to tackle it.	Suitable for parents and carers of primary and secondary school aged children and young people. (Waiting assessment or with a diagnosis).
