The Autism Berkshire Benefits Service can help autistic adults and the parents and carers of children and young people with autism, or who are waiting for an autism assessment.

We also provide help to those with related conditions, including severe dyslexia, dyspraxia, obsessive compulsive disorder (OCD) and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD).

Our expert adviser Kevin Jackson can help people to understand eligibility and assist with completing application forms for benefits including:

- Carer's Allowance
- Disability Living Allowance
- Employment & Support Allowance
 - Jobseeker's Allowance
- Personal Independence Payment
 - Universal Credit
 - Council Tax Benefit
 - Housing Benefit

Kevin is also able to assist with appeals against decisions made under the Department for Work and Pensions assessment process and to represent people at benefit assessment hearings and appeal tribunals.
